## The BIG Splurge

If you know someone who likes to travel with their own compliment of wine, then the **VinGarde Wine Valise** is an absolute necessity. It is a virtually indestructible wine carrying case, with a polycarbonate shell and dense closed-cell foam interior that can accommodate a full case of 750 ml bottles. It weighs about 48 pounds when fully packed – so you can check it as luggage on a plane under the baggage limit. The wine cavities are designed to hold a combination of almost any shape bottles, including traditional Bordeaux and Burgundy, to Champagne and Riesling.
